From the Desk of the Director

Happy New Year!

In one sense, of course, this greeting is a bit tardy. The liturgical New Year happened on December 1. Either way, this is a season of new beginnings; a time to reflect on the past and plan for the future. 2025 holds a great deal of promise as 14 deacon candidates from eleven parishes representing all seven deaneries will be ordained. That will take place on **June 14 at 9am** (the earlier time is due to a wedding that afternoon at the Cathedral).



This year we will have an in-service on **Saturday, March 29** with Sr. Ginger Downey OLMV. The topic will be the deacon's role as a

presider with a special focus on the new rites for Holy Communion and Worship of the Eucharistic Mystery Outside Mass. Sr. Ginger gave a similar presentation to the 2025 Candidates, and it was well received. I think you will find her quite engaging and helpful to your ministry at the altar. And don't forget to send in your Continuing Education Report (see page 13).

The retreat team is hard at work putting together plans for this fall (the date is TBD). The hope is to have a retreat like what we had this past year. If you have some ideas and want to contribute, please let me know and I will get you involved.

At our retreat in September, the community voted to overhaul the Constitution of the Deacon Council. Representatives from the Deaneries are working to reconfigure this important consultative body and hope to have it all put together before we gather for retreat.

The Personnel Board is working on revamping the deacon retirement policies as well as making a better distribution of deacons in our parishes. As you know, we have an aging diaconate as well as many parishes that are underserved by diaconal ministry.

As one cohort of candidates is ordained, another is entering candidacy and still another, Aspirancy. There are currently 16 Aspirants being vetted for Candidacy and an unknown number of men working on their applications to be admitted into deacon formation. Their deadline is March 31. If you know of a man who would make a good candidate, present him to your pastor and have him contact the Deacon Office.

On a final note, I want you to know how grateful I am for the opportunity to serve you and work with you in building the Kingdom. So many of you (deacons and wives) have given generously of your time both for the deacon community and for those in formation. Thank you for being the servants you were called to be!





Rebuild My Church Update

The Rebuild my Church Core Team continues their work in building a pastoral plan for the Archdiocese which will be customized for each deanery. In fact, the deaneries are the focal point of much of the "rebuilding" activity. Their efforts will wrap up this March. In fact, some of the deaneries have already submitted their reports. A ninth deanery was created for this process. It is comprised of the offices at the Archdiocesan Pastoral Center.

The five reflection themes for the Rebuild My Church initiative came from the synodal process held last year.

- a. Education and Formation
- b. The Role of Women
- c. The Life of the Spirit

What is a Jubilee Year?



"Jubilee" is the name given to a particular year; the name comes from the instrument used to mark its launch. In this case, the instrument in question is the *yobel*, the ram's horn, used to proclaim the Day of Atonement (Yom Kippur). This (Jewish) holiday occurs every year, but it takes on special significance when it marks the beginning of a Jubilee year. We can find an early indication of it in the Bible: a Jubilee year was to be marked every 50 years, since this would be an "extra" year, one which would happen every seven weeks of seven years, i.e., every 49 years (cf. Leviticus 25:8-13). Even though it wasn't easy to organise, it was intended to be marked as a time to re-establish a proper relationship with God, with one another, and with all of

creation, and involved the forgiveness of debts, the return of misappropriated land, and a fallow period for the fields.

Quoting the prophet Isaiah, the Gospel of Luke describes Jesus' mission in this way: "The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has anointed me to bring good news to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim liberty to captives and recovery of sight to the blind, to let the oppressed go free, and to proclaim a year acceptable to the Lord," (Luke 4:18-19; cf. Isaiah 61:1-2). Jesus lives out these words in his daily life, in his encounters with others and in his relationships, all of which bring about liberation and conversion.

In 1300, Pope Boniface VIII called the first Jubilee, also known as a "Holy Year," since it is a time in which God's holiness transforms us. The frequency of Holy Years has changed over time: at first, they were celebrated every 100 years; later, in 1343 Pope Clement VI reduced the gap between Jubilees to every 50 years, and in 1470 Pope Paul II made it every 25 years. There have also been "extraordinary" Holy Years: for example, in 1933 Pope Pius XI chose to commemorate the 1900th anniversary of the Redemption, and in 2015 Pope Francis proclaimed the Year of Mercy as an extraordinary jubilee. The way in which Jubilee Years are marked has also changed through the centuries: originally the Holy Year consisted of a pilgrimage to the Roman Basilicas of St. Peter and St. Paul, later other signs were added, such as the Holy Door. St. Stephen Fund



This fund is established according to the Archdioceses of Santa Fe by-laws and constitution. Assistance from the fund is intended to be a one-time gift, but under certain circumstances the St Stephen Fund Committee may decide to help on more then one occasion. The Permanent Deacon or widow requesting assistance must complete a Request for Assistance form and send to the St Stephen Fund Committee for review and then forward to the Office of the Director of Deacons for action.



Update your Continuing Education for 2024

Deacons are required to submit an annual report on their continuing education hours. We have created a simple form for you to complete: https://form.jotform.com/kdavis5430/ continuing-education-report-form or you may use the form located in Appendix E of he Deacon Policy Manual.

Each permanent deacon who is granted faculties to function within the Archdiocese of Santa Fe is expected to complete a minimum of **forty hours** of continuing education each year. Hours of continuing education are determined on the basis of clock time actually spent in attending formal classes, lectures, seminars, and workshops on academic subjects related to the personal development of the deacon as an ordained minister. In individual cases where remote location and great distance are a hardship, a deacon may devise a plan for acquiring the equivalent amount of continuing education by alternative means such as a self-study, correspondence courses and directed reading. This plan must be discussed with the deacon's pastor/supervisor and then submitted to the Director of the Office of Deacons. The educational portions of such gatherings as: In-Service Training Day(s), the annual weekend retreat for deacons and their wives, monthly deanery meetings and regional conferences of permanent deacons count toward the forty hours required yearly. The deacon must be specific when referencing the use of books (i.e., title, author and subject), videos or television programs (i.e., speakers name and subject).


Annually, in January, each permanent deacon is required to submit, in writing, a report of continuing education received over the preceding twelve-month period. Failure to comply may ultimately lead to a suspension of faculties.
