## **Rebuild My Church Update**

The Rebuild my Church Core Team continues their work in building a pastoral plan for the Archdiocese which will be customized for each deanery. In fact, the deaneries are the focal point of much of the "rebuilding" activity. Your support for this process is critical so please support the work of your respective deans in this effort.

The five reflection themes for the Rebuild My Church initiative came from the synodal process held last year.

- a. Education and Formation
- b. The Role of Women
- c. The Life of the Spirit
- d. Ecumenical and Interfaith Dialogue and Events, and
- e. Cultivating a culture of synodality that emphasizes listening and understanding.

Last fall a task force recommended a formation process and program for forming and assigning Parish Directors (PDs) formerly known as Parish Life Coordinators (PLCs). While there is no current need for PDs in the Archdiocese, it is anticipated that there

will soon be a shortage of priests to serve as pastors. Fr. Glenn Jones (Vicar for Clergy) has asked for a list of deacons who might be interested in pursuing a ministry as a Parish Director. These positions are normally full-time and demanding, but also fulfilling.



### **Deacon In-service**

We are happy to offer a workshop on homiletics for our deacon community. This project is partially underwritten by a grant from the Catholic Foundation. This will be a "hybrid" event. A small number will gather in person at the Catholic Pastoral Center (Sandia Room) while others attend virtually via Zoom. This decision was made to assist those outside of the ABQ metro area to attend without the burden of travel on a Sunday afternoon. The added benefit is that we will be able to record this event so that those unable to attend can benefit from the experience.

#### About the presenter:

Jay Cormier, D. Min. is editor and publisher of Connections, a monthly newsletter of preaching ideas, approaches and resources for homilists and preachers. He is adjunct professor of liturgical preaching at Pope Saint John XXIII National Seminary in Weston, MA., and lecturer in humanities and communications at Saint Anselm College in Manchester, N.H. Dr. Cormier leads workshops around the country for both clergy and laity in preaching skills and liturgy; he also facilitates training programs for professional, business and nonprofit organizations in communications and management issues.

Dr. Cormier is a regular contributor to the monthly prayer journal *Give Us This Day,* published by Liturgical Press; he has also written for America, Worship and U.S. Catholic. He is the author of several books in preaching, liturgy and communications, including The Deacon's Ministry of the Word (Liturgical Press); "Heaven Is Like": A Gospel Model for Writing, Preparing, and Delivering the Sunday Homily (Rowan & Littlefield); Lord, Hear Our Prayer: The Prayer of the Faithful for Sundays and Holy Days (Liturgical Press); and the series Table Talk: Beginning

the Conversation on the Sunday Gospel (New City Press).

A graduate of St. Anselm College, Dr. Cormier holds a master's degree in communications from Emerson College and a Doctor of Ministry degree in theology and communications from Andover Newton Theological School. He has served as Director of Communications for the Episcopal Diocese of Massachusetts, the Archdiocese of Washington (D.C.) and the Diocese of Manchester (N.H.).

Ordained to the diaconate in 2014 for the Diocese of Manchester (N.H.), Dr. Cormier serves as deacon at Saint Jude Parish in Londonderry, N.H., where he and his wife, Ann, make their home.



## St. Stephen Fund



This fund is established according to the Archdioceses of Santa Fe bylaws and constitution. It is an approved fund for the designated purpose of giving financial assistance to Permanent Deacons and/or their wives. The St Stephen Fund is intended to be temporary assistance during a time of crisis or when grave financial need has been identified. Assistance from the fund is intended to be a one-time gift, but under certain circumstances the St Stephen Fund Committee may decide to help on more then one occasion. The Permanent Deacon or widow requesting assistance must complete a Request for Assistance form and send to the St Stephen Fund Committee for review and then forward to the Office of the Director of Deacons for action.

## **Deacon Council Update**

The Deacon Council was created to represent the Deacon Community in advising the Archbishop on matters concerning the diaconate. However, the council has struggled in recent years and is in the process of rebuilding and reimagining itself.

Significant changes will be proposed for review and approval at the Deacon Retreat this September. They include the makeup of the council, how leadership is called and other changes to enable the council to perform its primary role.

According to the current Constitution, the purposes of the Council shall be:


- To serve as an advisory body to the Archbishop;
- To provide a forum in which input from deacons and their families can be communicated and acted upon; and
- To represent the Community of permanent deacons.

Our current structure relies on deacon and deacon wife representatives from each deanery who are elected to serve. But many of our deaneries are not effective in gathering deacons to meet; moreover, electing deacons and wives.

A task force from the current council membership is looking at ways to improve the effectiveness of the council. Their work will go through an approval process that ultimately includes the entire deacon community.

## **Deacon Personnel Board**

The Deacon Personnel Board, established by Archbishop Wester last October, is working on reviewing data received from the Deacon Survey. Criteria have been set to assist in reviewing the data. It includes sorting the information by deanery; reported amount of time in ministry: sorting to include parish and number of families registered. As more information becomes available it will be shared with the deacon community.

The Board is working on policies that will assist the Archbishop and the Director of the Office of Deacon. The policies are developed by the Board, reviewed by Fr. Glenn Jones, and sent to the Archbishop for his approval. These policies will then become part of the Deacon Manual. Several proposals are on the Archbishop desk for his approval and will be shared with the community.

A review of the process to requests a transfer from an assigned parish to another parish is taking shape. When a deacon is looking to be transferred, the first step is to request a transfer through the Director of the Office of Deacons. Once this is done the Director will inform the deacon of other necessary items. Final approve for a transfer is granted by the Archbishop.

Several parishes are in need of deacon. The first step for a pastor in requesting a deacon is for the Pastor to make the request known to Fr. Glenn and Deacon Keith Davis. It is always better to have a request in writing.







