



Rebuild My Church Update

The Archdiocesan Rebuild My Church Campaign is entering its final stage before promulgation on Wednesday, October 1, at the Cathedral Basilica of St. Francis of Assisi. Led by Arch-

bishop Wester and Michelle Montez, the planning process involved the creation of a strategic plan for each of the eight deaneries as well as the Pastoral Center. The nine plans are now complete and have been turned over to the Archdiocesan Pastoral Council which will develop a comprehensive plan for the entire Archdiocese.

The Deanery Plans will be promulgated by the Archbishop at liturgies in each of the deaneries prior to the final liturgy at the Cathedral. Those are currently being scheduled, so check with your Dean to find out when and where they will be held.

Thanks to all of you who participated in this endeavor.!

The purpose of this campaign is to initiate a new way of "being Church" for the Archdiocese. Not only does it recognize the value of collaboration within the deanery, but it demonstrates the value of listening.

May the Holy Spirit continue to guide us and lead our Archdiocese in its efforts to build the Kingdom.

Hispanic Deacons Wife Study

If you are an Hispanic Deacon and married, please consider passing this on to your spouse.

Dear Participant:

My name is Oscar Castellanos, a doctoral student at Marian University in Indianapolis, IN. I am conducting research as part of my capstone project in the topic of lived experiences of wives of Hispanic deacons and understand the support systems in the U.S. Catholic church.

You are invited to engage in a two-session interview, 60 minutes each, either via zoom, about how you experienced the formation process before and after the ordination of your husband. You and other women in similar positions have been invited; this would be considered a group interview.

The group interview will be recorded and transcribed for accuracy. You are not being compensated for this participation, which is voluntary. The interview results and feedback will be used in a qualitative capstone study, defended to a committee in an open public forum to satisfy a doctorate degree requirement, and the final paper may be published. **Your name and feedback will remain confidential**. You will not be identified individually. Any comments you state will be attributed to a pseudonym.

St. Stephen Fund



This fund is established according to the Archdioceses of Santa Fe by-laws and constitution. It is an approved fund for the designated purpose of giving financial assistance to Permanent Deacons and/or their wives. The St Stephen Fund is intended to be temporary assistance during a time of crisis or when grave financial need has been identified. Assistance from the fund is intended to be a one-time gift, but under certain circumstances the St Stephen Fund Committee may decide to help on more then one occasion. The Permanent Deacon or widow requesting assistance must complete a Request for Assistance form and send to the St Stephen Fund Committee for review and then forward to the Office of the Director of Deacons for action.



Deacon Paul Benoit Admitted to NMAA Hall of Fame



Paul Benoit is the 117th inductee into the New Mexico Activities Association Hall of Fame, with a career in education, coaching and administration that spans nearly 30 years. Benoit received his Bachelor's Degree from the College of Santa Fe in 1986 and his Master's Degree from Eastern New Mexico University in 1991. During his coaching, teaching and administrative career, Benoit worked at Tucumcari Schools, Estancia Schools, Animas Schools and Floyd Schools. Benoit was named NM Superintendent of the Year for the 2013-2014 school year and was inducted into the EPAC Hall of Honor in 2017, for his support of academic and athletic programs in the region and state. Benoit also was inducted into the NMCEL Administrator

Hall of Fame (2016-17) and has served on the NMAA Board of Directors and continues to serve on the Appeals Committee. Since retirement, Benoit continues to serve on and chairs the NMAA Appeals Committee. He also served on several educational organization committees, including NM Middle School Association, NM Coalition of Educational Leaders, NM Superintendents Association, and the NM Retired Superintendent Association and is a member of NMREA (Retired Educators). Benoit has been married to his college sweetheart, Lucia, since 1986. They have three children, Matthew, Alexis, and Hannah, all of whom are Floyd graduates. They also have a "bonus daughter", Jesica, a young lady they took in and fostered through graduation. In all, Paul and Lucia have 18 grandchildren.

Deacon Paul was ordained in 2023 and serves at St. Helen's parish in Portales. He is a member of the Deacon Personnel Board and the Decon Retreat Planning Team.


